



A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT DAN LEARY



SISTERS AND BROTHERS,


It is an honor to be leading our Local and I'm looking forward to a great 2024 for all of our members.

As your president, I was recently appointed to the state Energy Efficiency Advisory Council, which is under the Commonwealth's Department of Energy Resources. This is important for our Local because it will allow us to have our collective voice heard as the state creates new energy policies. I'm looking forward to advocating for our union in this new role and making sure our concerns are addressed as the state plans for the ongoing transition to green energy.

Also, Executive Vice President Robert Senier and I recently attended a meeting at Everett City Hall with the state Department of Public Utilities where Eversource, Unitil and National Grid proposed contracts to purchase liquified natural gas from Constellation LNG. While Mystic 8 and 9 will be closing soon, these new contracts will keep Constellation LNG running and keep our members working at that site in Everett. These agreements will also ensure that the LNG coming into the port at Constellation will get to the utilities to meet the demand, especially during winter months.

This year, we will continue to meet with the utility companies, legislative and regulatory agencies to discuss our union's role in the energy transition and protect the interests of our members.

Lastly, we recently started negotiations on a first contract at Cogentrix in Rumford, Maine. This is the UWUA's third contract with Cogentrix, which has two



other UWUA units at facilities in Tiverton, R.I. and Bridgeport, Conn.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

ARTIE DEVLIN



Artie Devlin has worked at power plants since 1989 when he started at Boston Edison and has been at the Mystic Generating Station for the past 23 years.

A Maine Maritime graduate with a marine engineering license, he started at Mystic in 2001 and has been there ever since. There are currently 30 members of Local 369 working for Constellation Energy at the station, which will officially close June 1. A small crew, including Artie, will stay on through the end of the year as operations are wound down.

“I’m going to miss it,” he said. “That’s been my life.”

Mystic has had many owners throughout the years and management changed frequently. But Artie says the core group of 369 workers at Mystic stuck together and kept the power running.

“We were changing hard hat names all the time, so that made things a little stressful,” he remembers. “Every company has their own sets of procedures.”

He recalls the group learning how to run Block 9 when it opened in 2003.

“It was all new. Most of the guys had never been in a combined cycle plant running turbines,” he says. “It was really fun learning. Being the first guys out there running the plant, we had to figure out a lot of stuff on our own.”

In 2008, he became chief steward and negotiated three contracts for the unit. The plant was set to shut down in 2022, but was kept open to provide power during winter months. While ships once brought liquefied natural gas down the Mystic once a week, the massive fuel barges are a rare sight these days, making deliveries only once every couple months.

Now 60 and with a daughter in college, Artie is planning to work at another plant once his work at Mystic is officially over.

“I want to congratulate the union guys at Mystic 8 and 9,” he said. “We’ve had a revolving door of managers. We’ve had a high level of operation and safety. The union guys have done a fabulous job running that plant over the last 20 years.”
